BISON HUNT

(Available May – September) Learn how to hunt big game by using an atlatl, a hunting tool used by prehistoric groups around the world, including Minnesota. Take aim at our bison target and learn how essential group hunting was to early Minnesotans.

> Grades: 3-up Session Length: 30-45 minutes



DIRT DETECTIVES

Monroe Location (Available May – September) Ever wonder what an archaeologist does? Experience the thrill of archaeology by digging for replica artifacts at our mock dig site! Learn the basics of excavation, mapping, and artifact documentation and discover how archaeologists learn about the past from what they find in the ground.

> Grades: 4-12 (can be tailored to younger groups if necessary) Session length: 45-60 minutes



POTTERY DESIGN

Explore how prehistoric pottery designs help us answer questions about civilizations of the past. Students will get to make their own decorated pottery sherd using similar methods found in the archaeological record.

COLLAGE

Create a picture by gluing items such as paper, foam, and string to a surface. Find new ways to use collectible materials.

> Grades: K-6 Session Length: 30-45 minutes

PRINTING

Design your own stamp from foam paper and create an abstract stamped picture with repeating patterns.

CAN YOU CANOE?

Practice boat-building skills and create a model size canoe from cardboard. Try to make it float in water for three minutes without having it sink or fall apart.

> Grades: 3–6 Session Length: 30-45 minutes

MOVE THAT LOCATION!

Learn about the history of locations (towns) on the Iron Range and why they had to be moved. Students will assemble their own location out of assorted boxes and attempt to move it 10 feet without the "town" collapsing.

> Grades: Pre-K – 6 Session length: 30-45 minutes

SNOW SNAKE GAME (Subject to snowfall) Discover the history of the Snow Snakes and why indigenous groups who lived in the snow played this game. Students will make their own snow snake to try and slide it the farthest.

> Grades: K-6 Session length: 40 minutes minimum Materials fee

Canoe crests helped identify different families throughout Minnesota's past. Design your own crest to represent your family.

> Grades: K-up Session length: 45 minutes

VOYAGEUR FRIENDSHIP BRACELET

Make a friendship bracelet using a fingerweaving technique like the Voyageurs used during the Fur Trade era.

> Grades: 4-12 Session Length: 30-45 minutes

WASHING CLOTHES/DETERGENT MAKING

(Available May – September) Travel back in time before modern machines and learn how to wash clothes by hand. Go from soaking to scrubbing to wringing and then hanging. Optional homemade laundry detergent making activity.

> Grades: K-6 Session Length: 30-45 minutes

ANIMAL TRACKING

Learn to recognize the tracks and furs of common animals that live in northern Minnesota, and find out what kinds of information tracks convey about the animals that leave them behind. Create a track in clay to take home using a realistic rubber animal foot stamp.

> Grades: Pre-K – 6 Session length: 45 minutes Materials fee

DEEP FREEZE OVER MINNESOTA

Investigate Minnesota's cold past by eating ice cream! Learn about glaciers and how they completely changed Minnesota's landscape through an ice-cream scooping activity.

> Grades: K-6 Session length: 30-45 minutes Materials fee

ENGINEERS OF THE WILD

Learn about Minnesota's animal engineers. Try your hand at building a beaver dam out of sticks and clay and see if you can make it hold water.

Grades: 4 – up Session Length: 45 minutes

IS THERE A CROCODILE IN YOUR BACKYARD?

Measure out the lengths of some prehistoric reptiles that lived in Minnesota and find out how Minnesota's environment used to be a warmer place for crocodiles.

> Grades: K-4 Session Length: 30-45 minutes

CREEPY CRAWLIES

Learn the differences and similarities between insects, spiders and other creepy crawly creatures. Make an insect out of pipe-cleaners and buttons to take home.

> Grades: 2 – 4 Session length: 45 minutes

SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS

The following tours can be scheduled upon request and are separate from the standard museum tour.

BEHIND THE VAULT TOUR

Ever wonder what a museum curator, archivist, or genealogist does? Now is your time to find out! Take a behind the scenes tour of MDC's library, collections, and archives storage areas while learning what the museum collects and how we preserve

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history. Note: participants must stand throughout the tour. Grades: 3-up

Group size: Limit 20 Session Length: 45 minutes (can be shortened if necessary)

MINERALS ROCK! TOUR

Learn about the fascinating properties of minerals, how they help us identify the minerals, and why they make the minerals useful to us. Try some of the actual field tests geologists use to observe mineral properties, and explore Minnesota's geologic history in our Hall of Geology.

Grades: 2 – 6 Session Length: 20-30 minutes

TROLLEY AND GLEN LOCATION TOUR (Seasonal)

Take a trip to the past on the Discovery Center Line trolley and tour the Glen Location, a recreated mining town. Ride the trolley and listen to stories of the Iron Range mining, transportation, and daily life. Tour our historic buildings, explore the vintage mining equipment, and enjoy your trip back in time. Available May through October; weather permitting.
